Judith is joining her younger sister, Wendy Mintz in her passing. Judith was the loving wife of Richard Lawrence Skrill, stepmother of Gabriel Skrill, and mother of two children, Benjamin Elijah Skrill and Joshua Evan Skrill. Judith fought an 18 month battle with colorectal cancer. In the end she passed peacefully and swiftly with her loving family around her. Her positive spirit and incredible strength were exemplified by her tremendous fight to live, which all her friends and family admired. Judith lived her life with an emphasis on spiritual simplicity. Previous to moving to Tucson in 1992, she worked in advertising in New York City, later working as a high style New York floral designer. 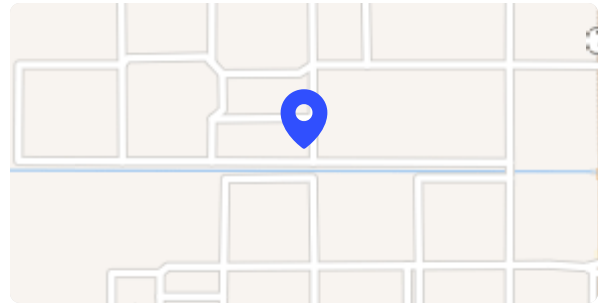

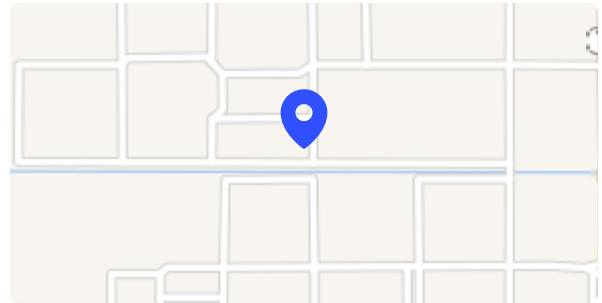
