Union College in Alliance, Ohio. He graduated with a Bachelor's in Ancient and U.S. History, from Mt. Union, a Bachelor's of Education and Chemistry from Akron University and Studied Law at Marshal Law School. Amerigo taught elementary school for 27 years, he also taught UFO courses at Akron University and at Mesa Community College in Arizona. UFO research has been a lifetime interest for Amerigo, he has been a writer, lecturer and investigator on the subject and has provided his research to the International UFO Museum and Research Center in Roswell, New Mexico. 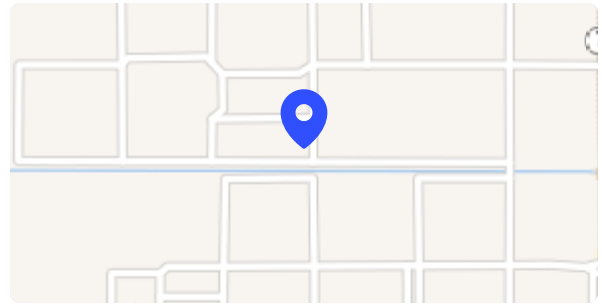
