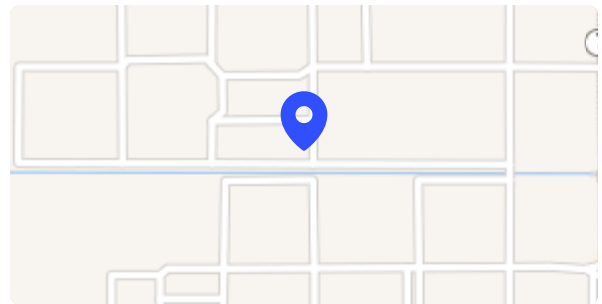
Simon will be missed greatly and will live forever in our hearts.

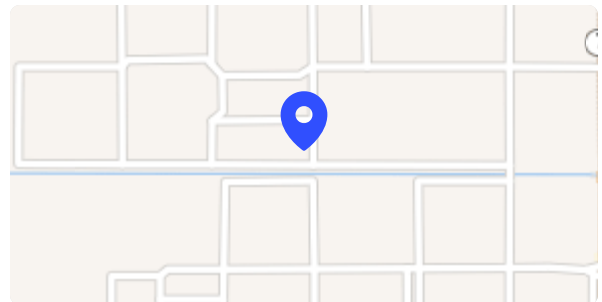

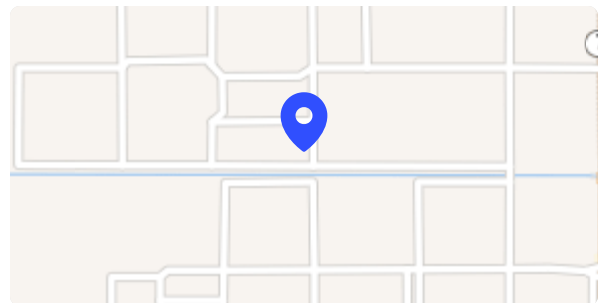
