Born on Christmas day in 1946 to Helen Gale Peer and Cecil David Peer in Davenport, Iowa, Michael was a man who embodied the spirit of the season – giving joy and spreading laughter wherever he went.

Michael is survived by his high school sweetheart and devoted wife of nearly 60 years, Linda E.
